The research work at the Royal Marsden is ongoing and we never cease to be amazed at their dedication and continued

quest. They are at the cutting edge of research into brain cancer and all the money raised for us continues to be directed towards research into Glioblastoma. It is reassuring to know that virtually every penny of the money raised is going to where we feel it is most needed and we know is being used wisely. The specialist nurse we are also helping to sponsor is now working with glioblastoma patients and their families offering informed, practical hands on support where it is much needed. Being able to talk to someone who understands what you are going through when diagnosed with a brain tumour, has time to listen and, most importantly, someone who knows the nature of the disease can make a world of difference to patients and to their families.

Dr Frank Saran, Consultant Clinical Oncologist and Head of Neuro-Oncology at The Royal Marsden has given us his latest progress report:

Dear Team and supporters,

The Neuro Oncology Research Department at the Royal Marsden are very grateful to have the continued support of the Alison Fracella Research Trust. Over the past number of years, the Trust's substantial contributions have helped to fund a interdepartmental research fellow and has supported our participation in national and international clinical trials. We are delighted to have the opportunity update the Trust on recent progress.

As you are all aware, the options for patients with newly diagnosed and recurrent high grade gliomas are few. At the Royal Marsden we are in a unique environment to have regular access to phase I trials, through the Drug Development Unit and phase II and III clinical trials in conjunction with our neuro-oncology unit. Over the past year, we have been able to offer patients access to several novel experimental drugs, including immune therapies. This year we look forward to opening a new study in collaboration with our colleagues across the UK which will expand the treatment options for newly diagnosed elderly patients whose treatment poses particular difficulties.

The Neuro Oncology Research Department continues to participate in several international multicentre trials. These allow us to offer our patients treatment options beyond the current standard of care, with a dedicated clinical fellow for these patients throughout their care.

This July will see the changeover of our research fellow who is the key to a seamless link of preclinical information, clinical trials and patients with primary brain tumours across the diversity of clinical departments involved in the care for these patients. Dr Scheryll Alken has been here for two years and has been a tremendous asset to the department and the patients. With great regret following completion of her contract we will have to let her return to Ireland to further her oncology training but are sure that is not the last the neuro-oncology community has seen of her. We are very pleased to announce that there will be a seamless transition to our new fellow who will arrive in July.

Early this year, the Neuro Oncology Research Department welcomed a new consultant appointment to the Neuro Oncology Unit, Dr Liam Welsh. Dr Welsh completed his oncology

training at the Royal Marsden and has a research interest in the use of advanced imaging to predict tumour behaviour.

With the support of the trust, we are collaborating with our colleagues in St George's Hospital and the Institute of Cancer Research to create a brain tumour tissue bank as well as expanding our portfolio to investigate new hypotheses in a preclinical setting via several newly appointed clinicians at the ICR with a track record in brain tumour research. This will provide us with the opportunity for extensive translational research, including the investigation of novel targeted agents for patients with glioblastoma.

Over the next year, we aim to increase the options for our patients by increasing the number of trials available. We continue to work with colleagues in the Institute of Cancer Research to identify potential targets for treatment. The work of the Alison Fracella Research Trust continues to be instrumental to take preclinical developments to the clinic and benefit directly patients with malignant brain tumours on a regular basis.
