Niamh writes:

Dear Team and supporters,

As I am coming the end of my time with the neuro-oncology unit I wanted to write to thank you for your continued support.

Your support and encouragement has been invaluable for my oncology training, and remains very much appreciated. I am delighted to say that my time in the unit, as well as resulting in an improvement in my clinical knowledge in neuro-oncology, has translated into a number of projects with the neuro-oncology unit and the Phase I unit. These have resulted in poster presentations at the annual American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO) meeting in Chicago 2016, the American Association for Cancer Research (AACR) annual meeting 2016 and the 12th meeting of the European Association of Neuro-Oncology (EANO) 2016. These

projects have been written up for publication, the full details of which will be provided in the near future.

We have improved links with the phase I unit, and increased trial participation with the Drug Development Unit in the Royal Marsden. We have also had an increased number of phase Will trials available in the neuro-oncology unit and with the dedicated research team, we have increased clinical trial participation in this setting. For example, in PARADIGM the phase I/II trial looking at olaparib and radiotherapy for patients with Glioblastoma, we are the highest recruitment centre in the UK.

Together with the research team, we have been able to provide a tailored patient-directed service, where I have been essentially the immediate physician-contact for all of our clinical trial patients. I have enjoyed this dedicated service, and I believe the patients have also benefited from this personalized-approach.

My involvement in the pre-clinical EGFR-mutated Glioblastoma laboratory work with

the Molecular Addictions team, led by Dr. Igor Vivanco, led to a further interest and

appreciation of science. This this inspired me to learn more about the biology of

cancer, and led to my application for the CRUK Clinical Fellowship at the ICR,

which I obtained successfully following a competitive interview process. I am due to

commence my academic research PhD with the Molecular Addictions team in January

2017.

This would, without a doubt, not have been possible without the support and influence

of this neuro-oncology fellowship, and as such I am incredibly grateful for the support

that this has offered me.

I hope to continue to contribute to cancer research, knowing that my time in the

neuro-oncology unit has been indispensable in shaping my career. I am sure the


physician that follows me will continue to make valuable contributions to the unit and
